Mr Pasupati Nath Chatterjee gave special focus on that a parents in humenory to know about this out in details wpecially there int belong to Special category. They are only able to study for 18 year. National Trust Specified for MR, CP, Autism and MD for developed in hold, helm, education to add them in our mainstream of society. So National Trust establish LLC for those disable person who does not get them right properly. Mr. K.C. Panbab explained a lot of scheme under National Trust Act for differently abled person. After taking the guardianship that should be the role of parents and must in the field of ----- & education. So Mr. K.C. Mr. Pandab allocated regarding UDID, Ration card (PDS) , Disability Pension , Accessibility and other Govt. facilities . Shri Mihir Kumar Mohanty, Swabhiman explained about

The discussion started with the benefits received from the PDS. Previously, they received food grains as per the selection of their choice of wheat and rice (2 K.Gs of wheat and 3 KGs of rice) For the past three months, the Government has stopped the distribution of wheat to the beneficiaries, and they only receive the rice from the Priority Household (PHH) category. The benefits they receive from the Government such as ration cards, health cards, Kalia & Kisan yojna, toilet built under the Swachh Bharat Mission, Bhima Bhoi Samarthya Sibira (awareness campaign), train pass, bus pass, disability certificate, etc. As the discussion was with the students who will continue their higher education, they know about the scheme, but those living in rural areas could not even be aware of any Government schemes. Villagers get information from the Sarpanch, but it's the sole responsibility of the word member to share information about all these schemes, but they need to do their job properly.
